About the Drake Wallace Memorial Scholarship and Student Composition Series

The MTSU School of Music announces the creation of the Drake Wallace Memorial Scholarship, an award created by the family and friends of Mr. Wallace, an MTSU Music student who passed away in October 2017. A highly talented and creative musician and the recipient of an MTSU Presidential Scholarship, Mr. Wallace was a senior majoring in Theory-Composition and Recording Industry. He loved writing, recording, and performing his own music. A graduate of Siegel High School, Mr. Wallace attended the Tennessee Governor's School for the Arts. In addition to this scholarship, the School of Music announces the Drake Wallace Memorial Student Composition Series, naming an ongoing series of concerts of music by School of Music composition students that is presented twice annually.

MTSU composition professor Paul Osterfield oversees these events each semester. "Drake Wallace was witty, intelligent, and affable, and he is missed by my colleagues, our students, and me," Osterfield said. "It is fitting to remember him by naming the student composition recitals in his memory. We are also grateful to his parents for their establishing a scholarship in his honor."
